Examine yourselves to see whether you are living in the faith. 2 Corinthians 13:5a

The new year has long been a time of making resolutions to better oneself and over the years I've discovered that some resolutions are more successful than others. To that end, I'd like to suggest five simple and powerful New Year's Resolutions inspired by St. Francis of Assisi that could make all our lives better.

First: Live Your Full Purpose in Life with Passion. "We should seek not so much to pray, but to become a prayer." If we choose to pray and live out our prayers, being mindful of those around us and how we interact, the world around us will be changed. May we not act with judgment or condemnation, but with love, joy and gratitude in all circumstances.

Second. Start by Doing What is Necessary. "Start by doing what's necessary; then do what's possible, and suddenly you are doing the impossible." Gain momentum for yourself by acting. Start at the beginning and manage each step along the way to gain traction. The more forward movement you achieve, the things you once found so difficult start becoming easier and can be found within your reach.

Third: Be a Light in the Darkness. "All the darkness in the world cannot extinguish the light of a single candle." In times of darkness, be the hope and encouragement to those in need. Let your kindness and compassion be a light to others. Look for new ways to give of yourself to foster light, beauty, peace and goodness.

Fourth: Always Do your Best. "The deeds you do may be the only sermon some people will hear today." Doing our best simply means living each moment to the fullest. It's not about success or failure, it's just about doing the best we can in every situation. See new opportunities in life as an adventure and realize that you can do anything you put your heart and mind to. Your actions may leave a positive lasting impression on someone today.

Finally: Love is Always the Answer. "Blessed is the servant who loves his brother as much when he is sick and useless as when he is well and can be of service to him. And blessed is he who loves his brother as well when he is far off as when he is by his side, and who would say nothing behind his back he might not, in love, say before his face." While loving one another is not always easy or our first response, let this concept be a challenge for you to focus on being more attuned to others. Recognize the value of people and strive to respond with love even in the face of hurt. Redefine your intent to love one another as showing kindness, compassion, healing and forgiveness. If everyone does their part to love one another, this world will become a better place. Choose love today.



#### Mission Partner: Family Resources, Inc.

Our mission partner, Family Resources, Inc., is a social services organization that provides several levels of outreach and care to community members in crisis. It has recently relocated from the Annie Wittenmeyer complex to a new location on Lombard Street that allows for expanded access as well as increased focus on building partnerships with other organizations.

One of its most active programs is its Survivor program targeting those who are victims of abuse, violent crime/homicide, human trafficking, etc. It offers emergency crisis assistance, shelter, counseling and therapy, support groups, and safety planning, among other support. This year, its crisis line has taken 17,980 calls. Other programs include Mental Health - offering help for stress, grief, anxiety and depression, Child and Youth services - offering help to children, youth and parents for behavior health, follow-up guidance, and support for those aging out of the foster system, and Licensing/Support for those who want to become foster parents or create adoptive families.

Each year, Family Resources offers the opportunity for you to adopt a family to provide holiday gifts as well as connect with the family to share the spirit of the season. The kindness of those who participate helps remind a struggling family that they are part of a supportive and compassionate community.

Like all of our mission partners, Family Resources exemplifies for us the love of Jesus reaching out to those in need.


